Pursuant to section 1042 of the Charter, the New York City Administration for Children's Services (ACS) sets forth below its regulatory agenda for the City's fiscal year of 2017:

DIVISION OF YOUTH AND FAMILY JUSTICE

1. **SUBJECT:** Continuity of Care for Youth in Detention Services
 - A. Reason: The repeal of Title 41, Chapter 3: Guidelines for Continuity and Provisions of Medical Care [for youth in Detention Services] is being considered because the Rule was passed when the New York City Department of Juvenile Justice (DJJ) was in existence; subsequently, DJJ became the Administration for Children's Services (ACS) Division of Youth and Family Justice (DYFJ).
 - B. Anticipated contents: Repeal of Title 41, Chapter 3: Guidelines for Continuity and Provisions of Medical Care [for youth in Detention Services].
 - C. Objectives: To repeal an obsolete rule that will be replaced by an ACS DYFJ Continuity of Care policy and procedure.
 - D. Legal basis: DJJ no longer exists.
 - E. Types of individuals and entities likely to be affected: Employees of ACS DYFJ and its provider agencies.
