I understand that the information I provide in the pre-registration form is used for reasons of public health and public

interest and thus it may be necessary to pass on my information to a third party. Information may be made available to emergency response teams and the fire department in case they have to respond to an emergency at my place of quarantine. Information will be available to the police, to ensure Yes people follow the rules in force. It will e.g. facilitate surveillance that individuals are staying at the provided address while in quarantine, according to the Act on Health Security and Communicable Diseases, no. 19/1997. Failure to comply may result in a fine and/or it can lead to refusal of entry or deportation

from Iceland. Personal data is treated under law No. 90/2018 on the protection of personal data and processing of personal data. I confirm that the above responses are given to the best of my knowledge

Travellers who present a valid certificate of full vaccination or previous infection:

You need to present a negative PCR test or antigen test for COVID-19 that is no more than 72 hours old at departure, **unless** you have ties to Iceland and are therefore required to undergo a COVID-19 test within two days of arrival. **If a recently positive PCR-test is presented** (older than 7 days but less than 180 days), a negative test is not required. Children born 2005 and later are exempt.

Airlines are obligated to check before boarding if passengers are pre-registered and can present a required certificate. If you're unable to present the appropriate certificates upon arrival you could be required to undergo a PCR-test at the border and follow rules of quarantine until results are received and you could be denied entry or be subject to financial penalties (however, Icelandic citizens will not be denied entry).

If certificates are approved you do not need to undergo quarantine but see below regarding testing if you have ties to Iceland or vaccination was completed less than 14 days ago.

Those who present a certificate of vaccination/previous infection that is **not** approved will be subject to a 5 dayquarantine on arrival, with a PCR test before and after the quarantine.

If a vaccination certificate fulfils all requirements except that 14 days have not passed since completion of vaccination, the certificate is accepted but you are required to undergo one PCR-test at the border and to follow rules of quarantine until the results are received.

A vaccination certificate is only valid if no more than **270 days** have elapsed from the primary vaccination when an individual has not undergone a booster vaccination. Primary vaccination is considered complete after two doses of vaccine or after one Janssen injection. A **booster** dose cancels this expiration date.

Travellers with ties to Iceland, e.g. Icelandic citizens or residents, those coming to Iceland for work or to study, need to undergo a PCR- or rapid antigen test within two days after arrival. This also applies to their accompanying families. Quarantine however is not required. The test is scheduled through the pre-registration. <u>List of testing centres</u>.

Travellers pre-registered for a 5-day quarantine and two PCR-tests:

A negative COVID-19 test must be presented that is no more than 72 hours old at boarding. Airlines are obligated to check before boarding if passengers are pre-registered and can present a required certificate. If you're unable to present the appropriate certificates upon arrival you could be refused entry at the border or be subject to financial penalties (however, Icelandic citizens will not be denied entry).

At the airport, you will undergo the first PCR test. Please have your passport and barcode ready. Rules of quarantine must be followed until results from the second test, 5 days after the first test, are received. The day of the first test is day 0.

Outside the airport – if in quarantine:

Use of public transportation is prohibited during quarantine.

Travel onward directly to the registered quarantine address provided in the pre-registration form by taxi or private transportation such as a rental or a private car. Flybus can be used. It is allowed to stay one night near the border station before proceeding to your location of quarantine. Passengers will receive their test results through text message to the mobile number verified during the registration process, or via email.

Test results are usually received within 24 hours. Results can also be looked up using your barcode on <u>travel.covid.is</u>.

Those in 5-day quarantine will receive a barcode after 4 days for the second PCR-test with instructions on testing locations. The day of the first test is day 0. E.g. if the first test is on a Wednesday the second test is on Monday and the barcode comes <u>on Sunday night</u>. Travellers must quarantine until they receive the test result from the second test. Information about quarantine is available at <u>covid.is</u>.

Children:

Please have your passport ready. Children born 2005 or later do not need to present a negative COVID-19 test on arrival and are also exempt from testing and pre-registration.

Transit passengers:

Transit passengers who do not leave the border station (airport) are exempt from border measures due to COVID-19.

Transit passengers who do leave the border station (airport), need to present a <u>negative COVID-19 test</u> upon arrival and must follow the rules applicable to other travellers including regarding testing and quarantine.

Privacy and data protection

The Icelandic Directorate of Health is the data controller for all data collected in regards to your travels to Iceland. All data will be processed in accordance with the EU's General Data Protection Regulation, GDPR, which has been transposed into Icelandic law.

The registration form will be kept in a database only accessible

by a selected group of personnel. All access to the data is strictly limited to what is necessary for the functioning of the border control measures.

Tests for COVID-19 sampled at the border are analysed by Landspitali – The National University Hospital of Iceland or contractors who the Landspitali has engaged to perform such analysis. The samples are only identified by a sample number and no other personal data will be available for those performing the analysis. All negative samples will be destroyed after the analysis has been performed. Positive samples may be kept for further analysis to assess which measures will be taken in regards to individuals who test positive for COVID-19.

Test results will be communicated by a text message to the phone number you provided in the registration form or your email. If you have an Icelandic identification number (kennitala) the results will be communicated through the website <u>Heilsuvera.is</u>. Anonymised test results will be used for statistical purposes.

If the results of the virus test are positive, the Landspitali COVID-19 outpatient clinic and the contact tracing team of the Chief Epidemiologist/Department of Civil Protection will contact you. Further processing of personal data relating to infected individuals is regulated by Icelandic laws on health records and laws regarding patient rights.

Information about your location of quarantine will be kept for the duration of the quarantine period and accessible for members of Department of Civil Protection who are responsible for the enforcement of quarantine rules according to Act no. 19/1997.
