Notice of Public Hearing and Opportunity to Comment on Proposed Rules

What are we proposing? The Taxi and Limousine Commission ("TLC", "the Commission") is proposing to amend the rules relating to the payment of round-trip tolls within the City of New York, specifically, the Verrazzano Narrows Bridge.

When and where is the Hearing? TLC will hold a public hearing on the proposed rule. The public hearing will take place at 10:00 am on August 9, 2023. The public hearing will be held online using Zoom. There will be no in person public hearing. The public hearing will be livestreamed on TLC's website at www.nyc.gov/tlc. Can I review the comments made on the proposed rules? You can review the comments made online on the proposed rules by going to the website at www.nyc.gov/nycrules. A few days

after the hearing, copies of all comments submitted online, copies of all written comments, and a summary of oral comments concerning the proposed rule will be available to the public at the Office of Legal Affairs.

What authorizes the Commission to make this rule? Sections 1043 and 2303 of the City Charter and Sections 19-503 of the New York City Administrative Code authorize the Commission to make this proposed rule. This rule was not included in the agency regulatory agenda as it was not contemplated at time of publication.

Where can I find the Commission's rules? The Commission's rules are in Title 35 of the Rules of the City of New York.

What rules govern the rulemaking process? TLC must meet the requirements of Section 1043 of the City Charter when creating or changing rules. This notice is made according to the requirements of Section 1043 of the City Charter.

Statement of Basis and Purpose

TLC's current rules require that passengers pay only for tolls incurred driving *to* the passenger's destination and no tolls for the *return* trip on all trips within the City of New York, except for trips over (1) the Cross Bay Veterans Bridge and (2) the Marine Parkway-Gil Hodges Memorial Bridge, both of which connect to the Rockaway Peninsula.

Although still within the City of New York, these two bridges operate with a two-way tolling system, which refers to the practice of collecting a toll over a bridge in each direction as opposed to only collecting a toll in one direction. Passengers are required to pay both the *to* and *from* tolls for these two bridges to prevent the Driver from incurring an additional expense to reenter the rest of the City from the Rockaway Peninsula.

Since December 2, 2020, the Verrazzano Narrows Bridge has operated with a two-way tolling system. There is no way to return from Staten Island to the other four boroughs without again crossing the Verrazzano, just as there is no way to return from the Rockaway Peninsula without again taking the Cross Bay Veterans Bridge or the Marine Parkway-Gil Hodges Memorial Bridge.

TLC proposes to amend its existing rules to add the Verrazzano Narrows Bridge to those bridges within the City for which passengers must pay the return toll.

TLC's authority for these rules is found in sections 2303 and 1043(a) of the New York City Charter and section 19-503 of the New York City Administrative Code.

Section 1. Paragraph (1) of subdivision (f) of section 58-26 of Title 35 of the Rules of the City of New York is amended to read as follows:

- (f) *Tolls What Tolls are Paid by Passenger.*
 - (1) On all trips within the City of New York, the passenger must pay:
 - (i) All tolls incurred driving to the passenger's destination
 - (ii) No tolls for the Driver's *return* trip, except for trips over:
 - A. The Cross Bay Veterans Bridge
 - B. The Marine Parkway Gil Hodges Memorial Bridge
 - C. <u>The Verrazzano Narrows Bridge</u>

Section 2. Paragraph (1) of subdivision (b) of section 59A-23 of Title 35 of the Rules of the City of New York is amended to read as follows:

- (b) Tolls What Tolls are Paid by Passenger
 - (1) On all trips within the City of New York, the passenger must pay:
 - (i) All tolls incurred driving to the passenger's destination
 - (ii) No tolls for the Driver's return trip, except for trips over:
 - A. The Cross Bay Veterans Bridge
 - B. The Marine Parkway Gil Hodges Memorial Bridge
 - C. The Verrazzano Narrows Bridge

Section 3. Paragraph (1) of subdivision (g) of section 82-26 of Title 35 of the Rules of the City of New York is amended to read as follows:

- (g) *Tolls What Tolls are Paid by Passenger.*
 - (1) On all trips within the City of New York, the passenger must pay:
 - (i) All tolls incurred driving *to* the passenger's destination.
 - (ii) No tolls for the Driver's *return* trip, except for trips over:
 - A. The Cross Bay Veterans Bridge[;], [or]
 - B. The Marine Parkway Gil Hodges Memorial Bridge, or
 - C. <u>The Verrazzano Narrows Bridge</u>.
